CHANGES TO THE SUMMER SPECTACULAR

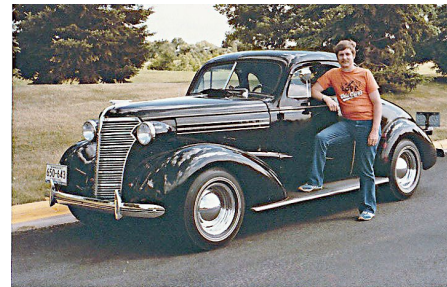
It's not too early to start talking about the Summer Spectacular 2024. At this time there has been a change. The show will be moved from Saturday to Sunday, August 25. The reason for this is that Buck Hill is planning to host a Farmer's Market on Saturday, August 24, and there would not be enough room to handle both events. Actually, we are quite optimistic in this change. There are far fewer car shows on Sundays, and our competition for cars will be less. We will see!

CHARITY AWARDS

In 2023, it was voted to donate \$6,000.00 from TSS profits and the Club treasury. At the meeting in January, members had a chance to discuss their chosen charities and a vote was taken on how the \$6,000.00 would be divided. Four charities will be awarded \$1,000.00 each, and the 5th will get 2 awards totaling \$2,000.00. These include: The Open Door Pantry in Eagan; Sharing & Caring Hands, Mpls.; Rosemount Beyond the Yellow Ribbon; Dakota Family & Kid's Clinic; and the Dakota County Technical College, Rosemount, which will get \$2,000.00, one for the auto body program, and one for the auto mechanics program. **Editor's note:** We as a car club feel it is important to support the auto programs at DCTC as much as possible.

MONTHLY MEETING MINUTES – Thursday, January 11, 2024 - Submitted by Rose Barclay

President: Duane Barclay called the membership meeting of the Southern Cruzers to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was observed.

Secretary's report: A motion was made by Pat Gansmoe and seconded by Ellen Heitzman to accept the minutes of the November 9, 2023, meeting as printed in the December Cruz News. The motion passed.

Vice President's Report: Steve Brehm reported from Arizona that he sent out 6 hard copies of the last Cruz News.

Treasurer's report: Chell Craigie read the Treasurer's report. Loren Bahls made a motion to approve the report. The motion was seconded by Ron Willson, and the motion passed. A call for bills was made. Judy Kemper submitted a bill for memorial money sent from the Club. Craig Duntley made a motion to pay the bill. It was seconded by Tim Gardner, and the motion passed. Jim Neher gave new income, from a membership, to Chell.

Membership Chairperson: Jim Neher reported Club membership is 84 (145 total). 71 members have renewed. In December the Club welcomed back Carol Oltmans of Apple Valley, MN. She has a 2002 Ford Thunderbird.

Activities: Ron Willson reported that on Wednesday, June 12, we will have a Club car show at the Legacy in Farmington.

Events: Rose Barclay reported that Ladies' Lunch Out is scheduled for Thursday, February 1, 2024, at 11:00 a.m., at Casper's Cherokee of Eagan.

Announcements: Duane Barclay reminded members that Club car plaques are \$31.00 from Ron Willson.

Old Business: Mark Peterson recapped all that he has done on the Club websites in 2023. In lieu of a stipend, Rick Delmonico made a motion to pay the yearly Club dues for Mark; Ron Willson seconded; and it passed.

New Business: Rose Barclay asked if members would like a Christmas party in 2024. A show of hands overwhelmingly said, "Yes." Members present felt that entertainment wasn't necessary.

Each of the 5 charities were presented to the Club by the person submitting the application. After the presentations, Ed Sanders made a motion to give \$2000 to DCTC, because it is for two separate programs, and \$1000 to each of the four remaining charities. Keith Biers seconded the motion, and it passed. The following charities will receive the \$6000: Dakota County Technical College; Open Door Pantry; Sharing and Caring Hands; Rosemount Beyond the Yellow Ribbon; and Dakota Family and Kids Clinic.

TSS Business: Craig Duntley and Gary Lyons met with a man from the Trader's Market in Elko. It had been suggested that this could be a site for the TSS. The cost would be \$500-\$1000. In addition, there are no toilets, so the Club would need to rent some. Also, there is no indoor building. Buck Hill may do a Farmer's Market on Saturdays. It was pointed out that there are fewer car shows on Sundays, so TSS could be on a Sunday. Craig will continue to work with Buck Hill.

The next meeting will be at the Apple Valley American Legion Post 1776, on Thursday, February 8, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. Ron Willson made a motion to adjourn the meeting. It was seconded by Craig Duntley, and the motion carried. The meeting was adjourned.

John also started his own business of technical furniture repair and restoration. Another of my memories is of John running, along with Club member, Jim Neher, the car show at the Dakota County Fairgrounds. John was often seen wearing his signature cowboy hat. RICHARD "DICK" HANSEN, AUGUST 21, 1934 - JANUARY 4, 2024

On January 4, Dick Hansen passed away. Dick was a Southern Cruiser member and is best known for his beautiful 1929 Cadillac which as the story goes, he built from a basket of parts. Dick was also a member of our Wednesday breakfast group at the Lakeville Perkins'. After graduating from Farmington High School, Dick served 5 years in the Air Force. Dick worked for Northwestern Airlines as a crew chief mechanic. After leaving the airline, he opened his own auto repair shop, 'Dick Hansen's Auto Repair.' After selling the repair shop, he changed his career to real estate, as an agent and broker.
